6+ HCP, so going to reply. Two possible bids spring to mind: (a) the L4 major at the 1 level, 1H, showing 6+ HCP and L4+H. (b) the “dustbin” bid, 1NT, showing 6-9 HCP and no particular shape.

There are pros and cons to both of these, so let’s run both and see what happens.

(b) E has an entry (♦A), so establish E's long suit and lead H. *This is less convincing.*

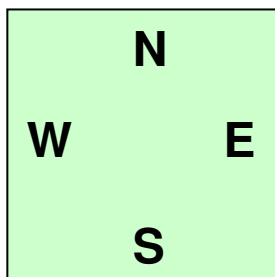

Now Dummy (South) goes on the table.

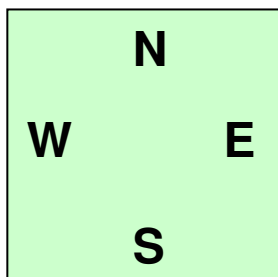

 Try for one from ♣JT, for this we really need W to lead a club.

Beware E’s long H. After winning ♥AKQJ, if E gets in with his ♦A, his 5<sup>th</sup> heart is a master.  
*You don’t know this yet, but it does become apparent on the second round of Hearts.*

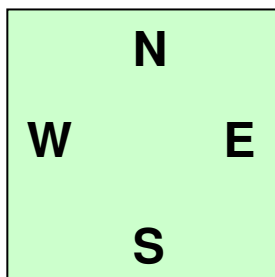

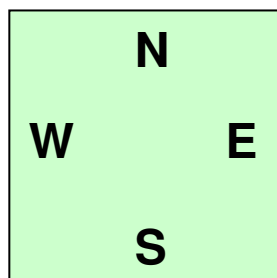

One from the ♦JT eventually. Try for one from ♣JT, for these we really want W to lead a club.

Even if tricks are ducked, the result looks to be the same, unless W foolishly leads a club.

Let’s follow both.
