Aware of the 4H possibility, {E} needs 10 tricks to get the 10 point NT extra score.

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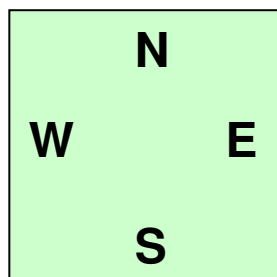

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Week 3 Targets

Points Target (*Evaluated Points rather than just HCP*)

| 24- | Part score |
| 25+ | Major Suit game & NoTrump Game |
| 27+ | Minor Suit game |
| 31+ | Small Suited Slam |
| 33+ | Small NoTrump Slam |
| 35+ | Grand Suited Slam |
| 37+ | Grand NoTrump Slam |

These do not mean you **WILL** make the relevant contract with that many points.

However the majority of the time you will fail if you have fewer and succeed if you have at least the points listed.

An example: A Small NoTrump Slam wants 33 Points. That means the opposition **could** have Ace and King in the same suit and thus may get the contract down by winning those two tricks. But most of the time they are different suits and you can defeat the King with **your** Ace.



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Week 3 More Targets

Contracts

Generally a suited contract is easier to make than a NoTrump contract - assuming that you have a large majority of the trumps.

In a suit contract where no ruffing occurs, the same result will occur in NoTrumps which will score 10 better.

ie: 3NT+1 might score +430
while: 4H= only scores +420

But in general the recommended aim is to bid a contract

- In a Major Suit or if you can't do that
- In NoTrumps or as a last resort
- In a Minor Suit. (11 tricks for game is hard.)

Note that the reluctance to bid a Minor Suit Game does NOT follow through to a reluctance to bid a Minor Suit Slam. The slam bonus is enough to make any slam contract good.



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Week 3 Yet More Targets

Aim

Once you are Declarer, the first part of your plan (with A-TT-IT-WD-E) is **Aim**.

In **Duplicate Pairs**, your aim is to **maximise** your score. Over many boards, it pays to be **greedy and take risks**. If you succeed even 75% of the time and go down 25% of the time, getting "90%" on successful boards and "10%" on unsuccessful ones; that is an average of $(90 + 90 + 90 + 10) / 4 = 70\%$. This is well above the ungreedy 50%.

In **Duplicate Teams**, the scoring is different using IMPs. Here you are best served with the aim of **making your contract** and **NOT taking risks**.

Opening a balanced hand (1) (Modern Plain Acol)

Last week we looked at balanced hand openings:

"Bal" means any of shape 4333, 4432 and 5332 not yet discussed.

Modern Plain Acol

Bid Higher ranking suit except:

"relay" means "just bid it without looking at your cards".

"neg" is short for "negative" and is the most common bid opposite a strong opening.

There are many other schemes for bidding strong NT openings. Confusing.

So how does partner respond to these opening bids?

Assume no intervention (overcall or double) by the opposition.

"Responding" to each opening

For each type of opening by partner, there are many responses depending upon what is held.

The initial version of this presentation endeavoured to present them all, a screen at a time, and it was overwhelming. I am now detailing each response for 0..11 and 12..14 Points from Opener. The others will be left for you to work out.



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

"Responding" to an opening "Pass"

0..11 Bal Pass

If Partner passed and the opposition did not intervene, you are in either 3rd or 4th seat making **your own opening bid**.

All you know about the passed hands is that they usually have 11- Points.

Some 'opening' players pass with 4333 shape, eg: xxxx Axx Axx Axx.

With 4441 shape you HAVE to lie when you open the bidding. You should have 13+ Points to allow you to manage the lie.

Otherwise not a lot to say here.



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to an opening "1NT" (1a)

12..14 Bal

1NT

Opener has a balanced hand (4333, 4432 or 5332)

If Responder also has a **balanced** hand with no L4+Major, can you make game or slam?

Note the "**no L4+Major**". Finding a major fit takes priority over a NoTrump contract, and so is bid *differently*.



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to an opening "1NT" (1bcdefgh)

12..14 Bal

1NT

With a **balanced** hand and no L4+Major, can you make game or slam?

0..10 Points

Joint = 12..24 Points. Game is not on. Pass

11..12 Points

Joint = 23..26 Points. If 23..24 Game is not on, but if 25..26 Game is worth trying. Ask Partner using "2NT" if he is minimum (12 ~ Pass) or maximum (14 ~ 3NT).

13..18 Points

Joint = 25..32 Points. Game on, Slam not. Bid 3NT.

19..20 Points

Joint = 30..34 Points. If 30..32 Slam is not on, but Game+1 is. If 33..34, Slam is on. Ask Partner using "4NT" if he is maximum (14 ~ 6NT) or non-maximum (12..13, Pass).

21..22 Points

Joint = 33..36. Small Slam is on. Bid 6NT.

23..24 Points

Joint = 35..38 Points. If 35..36 7NT is not on, but 6NT is. If 37..38, 7NT is on. Ask Partner using "5NT" if he is maximum (14 ~ 7NT) or non-maximum (12..13, 6NT).

and

25+ Points

Joint = 37+..39+. Grand Slam is on. Bid 7NT.



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to an opening "1NT" (1i)

Summary

12..14 Bal

1NT 

With a **balanced** hand and no L4+Major, can you make game or slam?

0..10 Points

Game is not on. Pass.

11..12 Points

Ask Partner minimum / maximum using "2NT".

13..18 Points

Bid 3NT.

19..20 Points

Ask Partner minimum / maximum using "4NT".

21..22 Points

Bid 6NT.

23..24 Points

Ask Partner minimum / maximum using "5NT".

25+ Points

Bid 7NT.

The key to all of these bids and to those on subsequent pages is that you work out **the range of what is jointly possible**. If some bid is "**certain**", **bid it**. But **ask if some bid may be possible** when opener is near the top of his range.



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to an opening "1NT" (1j)

Working it out

12..14 Bal

1NT

What you hopefully noticed with all those responses is that they were all worked out the same way with different thresholds: 25 for Game, 33 for Small Slam and 37 for Grand Slam.

Consider a Small Slam needing 33 Points.

If Opener has the minimum (12), you can guarantee 33 with $33 - 12 = 21$ Points. So with 21 or more you bid the Small Slam straight away.

If Opener has the maximum (14), you have a joint 33 with $33 - 14 = 19$ Points. There **iff** opener has maximum, you can bid a Small slam with 19 (or 20). But you have to **ask** if Opener has the maximum, which is done with a bid above Opener's and below the target bid.

We use 4NT to ask about 6NT and we use 5NT to ask about 7NT.

The same scheme applies to other targets and to other openings.

* **iff** = *if and only if*



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to an opening "1NT" (2)

Summary

12..14 Bal

1NT

With a **shapely minor** hand (L5+Minor and no L4+Major).

This is the same as the balanced responses except for 0..10 points where for an L6+Minor you use a transfer to achieve a "weak take out".

| | |
|---------------|---|
| 0..10 Points | Game is not on. Pass with L5Minor. With L6+Minor, use a Minor Transfer as take-out. |
| 11..12 Points | Ask Partner minimum / maximum using "2NT". |
| 13..18 Points | Bid 3NT. |
| 19..20 Points | Ask Partner minimum / maximum using "4NT". |
| 21..22 Points | Bid 6NT. |
| 23..24 Points | Ask Partner minimum / maximum using "5NT". |
| 25+ Points | Bid 7NT. |

(Minor Suit Transfers another week.)



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to an opening "1NT" (3)

12..14 Bal 1NT

With a **4-card major** hand (L4Major) consider using Stayman (2C).

It is complex holding L4OneMajor & L5+OtherMajor.

(More another week.)

With a **5-or-more-card major** hand (L5+Major) use Transfers (2D or 2H).

(More another week.)

With a **6-or-more-card minor** hand (L6+Minor) where a NT contract seems inappropriate, use a minor suit Transfer (2S).

(More another week.)



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to an opening "1Suit" (1)

15..19 Bal

1 Longest Suit then Rebid Raise/Jump in NT

The responses here are the responses to a 1 Suit opening. At the first response, it could be a "normal" 1Suit or the pre-cursor to a NT bid.

The initial response can be summarised as: (LT = Losing Tricks)

With L4+Support for a major suit:

6..9 Points (or 9LT)

2MajorSuit

10..12 Points (or 8LT)

3MajorSuit

5..10 HCP, 13+ Points (or 7LT)

4MajorSuit

13+ Points (Strong HCP)

Initially change the suit, then rebid 4MajorSuit. *Delayed Game Raise*

Without Support:

0..5 Points

Pass

6+ Points

Bid an L4+ suit at the 1-level

10+ Points

Bid an L4+ suit at the 1-level if you can, else bid at the 2-level.

6..9 Points and no L4Suit biddable

Bid 1NT. *The Rubbish Bin Bid*



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to strong balanced opening hands (1)

Rather than go through multiple pages developing the point ranges for each response bid for each strong opening bid, we are going to work out how to determine the ranges for each response using the Benji 21..22 Point bid.

21..22 Points, Balanced 2C ♦, 2D relay, 2NT

That is a Point **range**, so the responses will include "asks".

(If the opening bid had been a single value, then no asks are required.)

Here Balanced also includes "Unbalanced L5+Minor".

We also need to know the Threshold we are considering. Here we use 33 Points for a Small Slam.



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to strong balanced opening hands (2)

21..22 Points, Balanced 2C ♦, 2D relay, 2NT

The responses are:

Can't do anything

Even if Opener maximum, no Game.

Maybe Game

If Opener maximum, Game on; else not.

Definitely Game

Even if Opener minimum, Game on.

Maybe Small Slam

If Opener maximum, S.Slam on; else not.

Definitely Small Slam

Even if Opener minimum, S.Slam on.

Maybe Grand Slam

If Opener maximum, G.Slam on; else not.

Definitely Grand Slam

Even if Opener minimum, G.Slam on.

As we are considering Small Slams, we are interested in what is required to bid

Maybe Small Slam

and

Definitely Small Slam



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Week 3 Balanced Hand Openings

Responding to strong balanced opening hands (3)

21..22 Points, Balanced 2C \diamond , 2D relay, 2NT

Threshold 33 Points **Maybe Small Slam** and
Definitely Small Slam

What do we need to be able to **definitely** bid our Small Slam target?

If Opener is minimum we need **Threshold - Minimum** Points
Here: **33 - 21** = **12** Points

What do we need to **maybe** bid our Small Slam target?

If Opener is maximum we need **Threshold - Maximum** Points
Here: **33 - 22** = **11** Points

So for **Maybe Small Slam** we need 11 to (12-1) Points
which is actually just **11** Points

And for **Definitely Small Slam** we need **12+** Points

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Week 3 Play

Play

NS have the pair number of their table, N has his back to the stage.
EW have the pair number of their table plus 8.

Play boards in sequence. Have an incoming pile and an outgoing pile. Pass outgoing to next **lower** numbered table – Table 1 to highest table.

Many boards have instructions on coloured card. **The appropriate people should read each card at the time it says and follow its instructions.**

If you play a board twice, record second play on traveller with pair numbers PLUS TEN (eg 1 v 9 becomes 11 v 19)

As part of the learning process – I would like the partner of whoever has just bid to take whatever action is **standardly required** (eg announcing 1NT to be 12-14 points, ALERTing a conventional bid, ...) – **AND ALSO** to give a brief **description** to the other three players on what the bid means.

If you wish to fill in a personal results card, they are available here. They are commonly used at duplicate clubs.

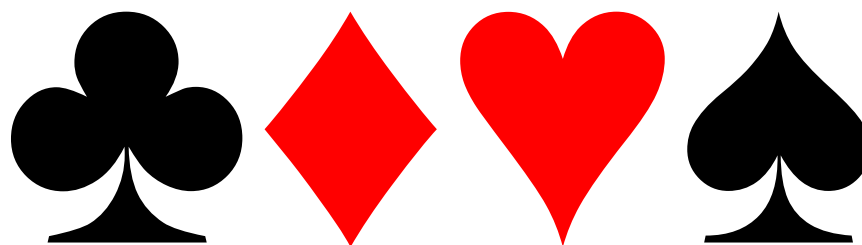

Ref 6NT= N 10S 12 1440 -

Both opening leads are unusual, largely forced by the fact that the {E} hand has no traditional lead. 10S is not from S:T98. 4C is 4th highest but not to an honour.

There are 11 Top Tricks. The key to this deal is the two finesses (QH in H:Qxx and JD in D:AKJ) for the 12th trick.

Playing the QH **first** results in either a 12th trick (QH works or KH played and QH ducks) or a lost trick. If a lost trick, the JD finesse can still be taken.

Playing the JD **first** results in either a 12th trick (JD works or QD played and overtaken by AD promoting JD) or a lost trick. If a lost trick, when the QH finesse is played, the KH will win whether with {E} or with {W}.

So the QH finesse must be played first. Having a master above the JD makes it safe to leave that till last.

Ref b 2NT= N 2C 9 - 150

It looks as though 2C (from C:JT62) to two honours (JT) is a better opening lead than 5D from D:Q975 to 1 honour which might be frozen. But it turns out that the C lead allows {NS} an overtrick.

This hand was used as week 901#1 and the cards inserted into board 10 in error. However it was educational and interesting to see what happened with {E} as Dealer. It is a highly artificial hand designed to make players think of how opposition might react. *Renamed from 10 to 410. Bidding from memory.*

Obviously {N} can make 7C for {NS} 2140, but in 7NT would make zero tricks.

{E} was too strong to open a pre-emptive 3D, yet it didn't seem suitable for a Benji strong opening, 8..9½ playing tricks. So opened 1D, waiting.

1D (1H) P (#3C) // 3D (?)_[1] ?_[1] (7C)_[2] // 7D_[3] (X) P (P) // P

[1] Can't recall what was bid here

[2] {N} thought 6C more likely to succeed, but wanted to see what 7C did.

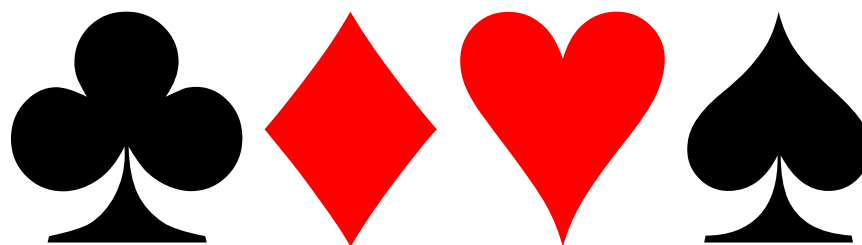
