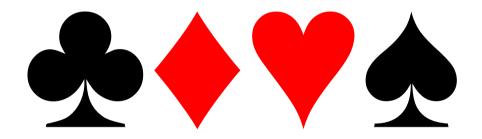



### **Opening Lead** ~ Rank

Today's topic is Opening leads.

Last time we looked at which rank card to lead within a suit.

This summary is of **default lead card ranks for each length & type of suit**. It does not have any bearing on whether you should be leading that suit - that is a separate decision (today's video).

As with everything else in bridge there are occasions when you should do something different to the norm.

Often the same principles apply when mid play and leading the first card of a new suit.

### Opening Lead ~ Generalities

Longer suits are usually more valuable than medium/short length suits.

Often the "defaults" say 1+honours preferring 2+honours. This is as 1 honour could be a "frozen suit" and give away a trick. Avoid where possible.

Leading short suits may be because you want to trump the suit later. Singletons in a trump contract can be good. Doubletons are too slow to often work.

Honour headed sequences:

Suit contracts ask for 2+. After 2 tricks, 8 cards there are only 5 still out and someone will be trumping further tricks.

NoTrump contracts ask for 3+. After 3 tricks, often the opponents will be void in the suit thus establishing "all the small cards" remaining in your long suit.

Often whether a particular card is a "high spot" or a "low spot" card can only be determined by viewing all the cards in hand and on the table and by considering the auction.

### Opening Lead ~ Suit Contract

#### **Overarching statements.**

Do not underlead an Ace. If you must lead the suit, lead the Ace.

A low spot card promises an honour in that suit. A high spot card denies one.

If leading trumps, ignore the list below and just lead a low one.

When leading Partner's suit, use the list below, not 'Top card' of your holding.

- **List** This is sorted by suit length, not by "priority":
- 4+ Near top (occasionally top) of rubbish (no honours).
- 4+ Fourth highest of longest and strongest to 1+ honour (2+ preferred).
- 3+ Top of an honour headed sequence of 2+.
- 3 Low to 1+ honour (2+ preferred).
- 3 MUD (Middle Up Down) if no honours.
- 2 Top of doubleton (except bare AK then lead K).
- 1 Lead singleton. *Allows ruffs of the suit.*

### Opening Lead ~ NoTrump Contract

#### **Overarching statements.**

You may underlead an Ace. In NT you are trying to establish long suits (your's or partner's). 3+ rounds are required to do that.

A low spot card promises an honour in that suit. A high spot card denies one.

When leading Partner's suit, use list below, not Top card of your holding.

- **List** This is sorted by suit length, not by "priority":
- 4+ Near top (occasionally top) of rubbish (no honours).
- 4+ Fourth highest of longest and strongest to 1+ honour (2+ preferred).
- 4+ Top of an honour headed sequence of 3+ (Hhh) (or broken Hh\_h; or interior (h\_Hh)
- 3 Low to 1+ honour (2+ preferred).
- 3 MUD (Middle Up Down) if no honours.
- 2 Top of doubleton (except bare AK then lead K).
- 1 Singleton. Rarely a good lead in NT.

#### Play

#### Play as if "Duplicate Pairs".

{NS} have the pair number of their table, {N} has his back to the stage. {EW} have the pair number of their table plus 8.

Play boards in sequence. Have an incoming pile and an outgoing pile. Pass outgoing to next lower numbered table – Table 1 to highest table.

Some boards have instructions on card. The appropriate people should read each card at the time it says and follow its instructions.


If you play a board twice, record the second play on the traveller using your pair numbers PLUS TEN (eg 1 v 9 becomes 11 v 19)

If you wish to fill in a personal results card, they are available here. They are commonly used at duplicate clubs.

Don't forget to describe partner's bids and plays to the table.

Note that these set hands are designed to fail. If the defenders get it wrong, then declarer will get a good score (typically contract making). If the defenders get it right, then declarer's score will be worse, often just by one trick.


