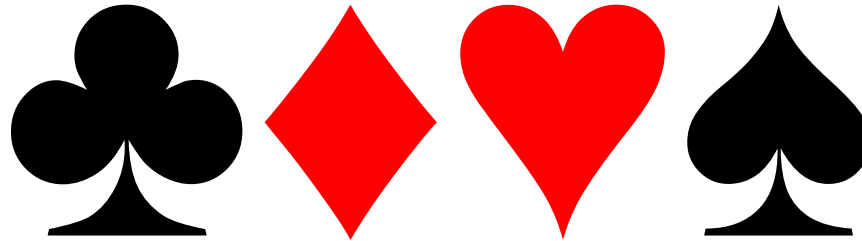

The first thing that should happen at a bridge table is for {N} to fill in the table slip. He may not be able to complete the table number or the pair numbers until the movement cards are distributed, but it should be finished as soon as those values are known.

At U3AIB, if the table has five players, one sitting out, please add that name at the bottom.

On the EBU (English Bridge Union) slips, the small boxes do not exist and instead there is a space for each players EBU number.

If you attend U3ASH, you may be aware we occasionally use sections there, with two sets of boards circulating and the sections being Red and Yellow.

Week 12 Duplicate

For those who haven't been to a Duplicate club, there are two common formats. Most clubs play PAIRS where the scoring is "matchpoints", but events tend to be TEAMS (of 4) where the scoring is IMPs.

Why is it called DUPLICATE? Because the same deal is played at many different tables. Online, everyone can play the same deal at the same time - a computer can duplicate the cards without problem. Face to face, one physical board has to move around the tables and be played by different people at different times.

In this situation your objective is NOT to do better than the pair you are playing against, but to do better than other pairs sitting in the equivalent seats to you when they play that same board. In other words, who can get the best result from the cards they have been dealt. How lousy your hand is, is irrelevant.

If you can declare 3NT and manage 3NT-3 and everyone else only achieves 3NT-4, you have a TOP score on the board.

To provide a good mixture of play between different pairs, combined with not repeating any pair playing a board twice, means that complicated MOVEMENTS are required. The EBU has published a movements' book.

Pairs take their pair number for the session from the "round 1" rows of the table they first play at.

Here one pair (6 highlight in green) stays still and everyone else moves.

This is useful if a disabled player is playing.

Pair 1 (in tan) is typical of the movement of everyone else.

Here everyone plays all boards, it isn't always so.

As a separate activity, we could have a long discussion about each result.

Why/how were the contracts bid, Was it declarer's good/bad play or the oppositions skill/mistakes that caused the result. Could either pair have done better? Was the opening lead wise?

The last 6 columns present the same information 3 times. The yellow highlight are what are known as "Matchpoints". The blue and orange highlights show which 3½ other pairs {NS}5 did better than and which 1½ other pairs {EW}13 did better than. This can all be converted to percentages on the right.

Add YOUR {NS} score to YOUR {EW} score. Eg $-140 + 110 = -30$.

There is a table of IMPs (International MatchPoints) on your Record Card.

The result of this change of scoring method is that the strategy for Teams and Pairs is different. In PAIRS, taking risks to get an extra score of even 10 is worthwhile, 3NT+1 (430) beats 4H=(420). In TEAMS, making a contract is far better than failing, don't take risks, and GAME is much better than a part score.

Add up your team's IMPs across all boards. Highest wins.

Some events convert IMPs into Victory Points - not discussed today.

Imagine that you are Pair 3, determined by what the movement card said at the start of Round 1.

(So if you were seated {EW} at this table at the start of round 1, you would be known as Pair 1 for the entire session.)

At the end of round 3, where do you think you should move to?

Yes, Table 2 {NS}.

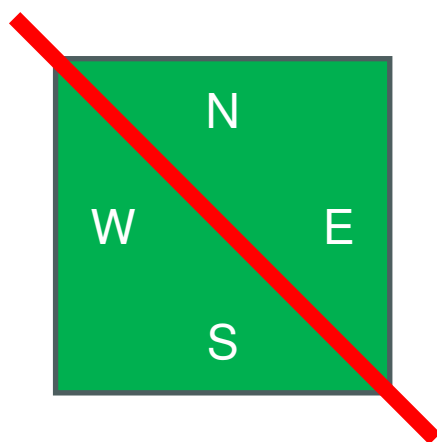
Week 12 Movement

One other thing that many folk do not know and that those who know do not seem to understand.

Sometimes you will sit in the {NS} seats and sometimes the {EW} seats. Divide the table into 2 halves diagonally.

If you sit in the {N} or {E} seat at round 1, always sit in the {E} or {N} seat in every other round.

If you sit in the {W} or {S} seat at round 1, always sit in the {S} or {W} seat in every other round.



Never cross the diagonal line.

Week 12 Movement

North is responsible for checking that the correct pairs (including himself) are at the right table and in the right seats.

North is responsible for ensuring that the correct boards are played and are in the correct orientation before the cards are taken and before they are returned.

Everyone should shuffle their hand before returning the cards to the board. This is so that the next table to play the board doesn't get information from the order of the cards in the board.

(And of course, North is responsible for filling in the traveller. Whilst East is responsible for checking that the entry is right:

- Section (if needed, eg Red/R or Yellow/Y) and Board number right?

- Correct row?

- Correct EW pair number?

- Correct contract including double/redouble and preferably result. (5Dx-2)

- Correct Opening lead – card, not just suit. (6C (or C6), not just C)

- Correct number of tricks made.

- Correct score in the correct column: {NS} points on the left, {EW} the right.

)

Week 12 A Simple Movement

Imagine a simple 4 pair, 2 table, 9 board, 3 round (3 boards per round) event.

In each round the 3 boards are **shared** between both tables. One on each table and one on a chair between the two tables. Whichever table completes playing their first board first swaps the third board with their board. Usually the second table will finish their board before the first table finishes their second, they swap. Then the 1st table swaps & lastly the 2nd table swaps.

So everyone plays all 3 boards without any waiting. All covered by the board on the chair.

Maybe Bd 1 is quickest and board 2 slowest. You might get:

Week 12 Recording Results

Each time a game is played it is recorded in three different places, as defined by three different keys:

- Board number (each entry records the various results for “this” deal.);
- {NS} pair (records the results from each board {NS} played);
- {EW} pair (records the results from each board {EW} played).

Thus full recording is done in 3 places:

- Traveller; which records what happens each time a **specific** deal is played;
- {NS}'s record card, which records who and what happened each time **{NS}** played;
- {EW}'s record card, which records who and what happened each time **{EW}** played;

Obviously if all 4 players choose to make record cards, there will be 2 duplicate record cards by the {NS} pair and 2 duplicate record cards by the {EW} pair. Note that each pair is likely to only be {NS} for some of the boards and to be {EW} for others.

And at U3AIB, with 4 travellers per board, there will be 4 quadruplicate travellers.

Read the headings.

Please put "Contract and result" in the Contract column. (Eg "5Dx-2".)

Put the actual card in the "Opening Lead" column, not just the suit. (Eg "6C" or "C6".)

Scores don't use "+" or "-". Just put the *number* in the relevant column.

Week 12 Play

Play

Play as if "Duplicate Pairs".

{NS} have the pair number of their table, {N} has his back to the stage.

{EW} have the pair number of their table plus 8.

Play boards in sequence. Have an incoming pile and an outgoing pile.

Pass outgoing to next lower numbered table – Table 1 to highest table.

Some boards have instructions on card. The appropriate people should read each card at the time it says and follow its instructions.

If you play a board twice, record the second play on the traveller using your pair numbers PLUS TEN (eg 1 v 9 becomes 11 v 19).

If you wish to fill in a personal results card, they are available. They are commonly used at duplicate clubs.

Don't forget to describe partner's bids and plays to the table.

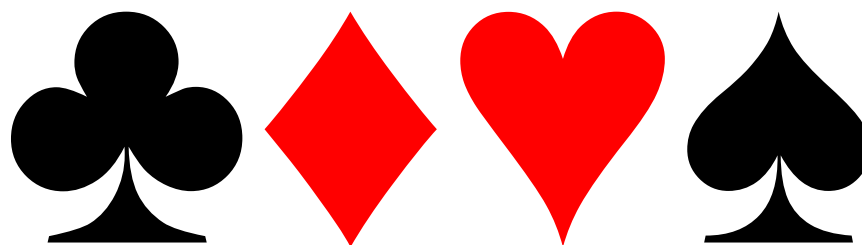

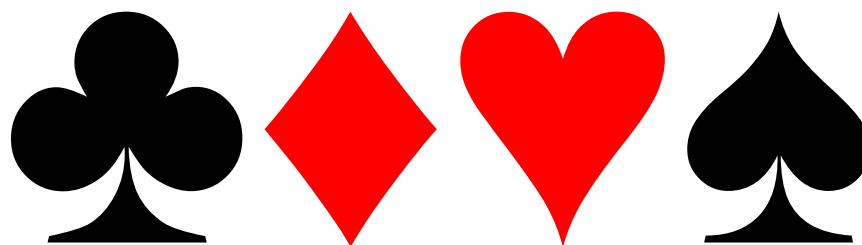
